

## MILO Years 2 and 3: how to record the score

- Sit with the opposition team's scorer and work in partnership; check regularly that your score tallies with that of the other scorer
- Record the result of each ball in the box that corresponds with the batsman who faced the delivery, as follows:

1 (2, 3)	one run (two runs, three runs) scored, whether off the bat, leg byes or byes
• (dot)	no runs scored
+	wide
O (circle)	no ball
B	batsman dismissed bowled
C	batsman dismissed caught
R	batsman dismissed run out
+2	wide from which two additional runs (byes) are run
O1	no ball from which one additional run is run
R1	batsman dismissed run out attempting a second run (all completed runs count)

- Example:

Notes:

- Runs scored from **byes** and **leg byes** are not recorded separately; credit these to the batsman who faced the delivery
  - Wides** and **No Balls** are not credited to the batsman's score; additional runs taken from a wide or no ball count towards the batsman's score
  - When a batsman is run out, the 'R' should be recorded against the batsman dismissed rather than the batsman who faced the delivery. If the dismissal occurs on a second or subsequent run, this may result in score sheet entries for both batsmen (in the example above, the last ball of Over 4 was hit by Bob for one run, after which Jim was run out attempting a second run)
- Record the names of fieldsmen who take catches or effect run outs, in the boxes provided
  - At the end of each batting partnership, record in the right-hand columns the runs scored by each batsman, wides/no balls bowled and wickets lost during the partnership. Sum the runs and wides/no balls for the two batsman in the 'Partnership' column
  - At the end of the innings, calculate the final score:

sum the total runs scored by all batsmen; record in box T1  
sum the total wides/no balls bowled; record in box T2  
sum the total wickets lost by all batsmen; record in box T3

Each wide and no ball counts as one run; two runs are deducted for each wicket lost. Thus the final score (T4) is calculated as  $T1 + T2 - (T3 \times 2)$

- Pair 5/Over 5 sections are used only when a team fields more than eight players
